Dr. Meldon Kahan, MD, CCFP, FRCPC is currently an Associate Professor in the Department of Family Medicine at the University of Toronto, and Medical Director of the Substance Use Service at Women's College Hospital. Over the years he has written a number of peer-reviewed articles, guidelines, and educational publications on addiction-related topics. Dr. Kahan is also the medical lead on META:PHI, a provincial initiative to support the establishment of rapid access addiction medicine clinics and expand best practices for managing addictions.
